Rabies Vaccine Bait Drop

HALTON HILLS, ON – The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry is issuing vaccine bait by air and by hand to address the fox and raccoon strain of rabies. The vaccine contained in the bait packets is labelled and is not harmful to people or pets however it is recommended that anyone coming in contact with them should see a doctor or veterinarian.

The aerial drop was conducted this week, primarily in areas south and west of Halton Hills.

"This a provincial program to support the overall goal of eradicating rabies", said Mayor Bonnette. "While it's unlikely that people will come across a vaccine packet, I do ask that these be left in place for the wildlife to consume."
